Labour government puts KGH upgrade at risk

UNDER THE CONSERVATIVES



- Multiple debates secured in Parliament.

'Out of touch' Green Party votes for uncontrolled immigration

Local people have consistently told us they want to see stricter controls on immigration. Before leaving office, the Conservatives had brought small boat crossings down by 29% on the previous year and had reduced by 11% the number of work visas granted to main applicants in all work categories in the year up to June 2024.

However, the Green Party have chosen to completely disregard local opinion here in Burton Latimer by voting for a commitment to "dismantle the Home Office", for "a world without borders" and claiming that "migration is not a criminal offence under any circumstances". These unworkable policies are completely at odds with the views of local people, who have told us they would much prefer to see tighter controls on immigration to the UK.

SAVE THE WINTER FUEL ALLOWANCE! LABOUR GOVERNMENT URGED TO U-TURN

Local Conservatives are backing the campaign to restore the Winter Fuel Allowance. Labour's Chancellor Rachel Reeves MP recently announced plans to introduce means testing, designed to save "£1.4 billion". This decision is likely to affect up to 10 million pensioners.

With over £24 billion spent in their first 24 days, the Labour Government needs to come clean about whose decisions are making public finances worse.
